2/13/11- Report of the ad hoc committee on Regional Liability Insurance

As reported at the last few RSC meetings, this region has been discussing the possibility of acquiring an 'umbrella' insurance policy for all the NA groups in the New England Region for years. Having found significant support for the idea at every step of the way, we are near the end of the process. We have an Insurance agent who has given us a quote of \$2318.00 to provide liability insurance for our region through the Philadelphia Insurance Co. I sent my report to the regional meeting list a couple weeks ago when I was given the dollar amount of the policy, which is \$2318 per year. A motion was made in new business at the last RSC for the consideration of the areas in our region, in the hopes that we could move on that motion in new business today. *

As I reported and we discussed in February, we also proposed a mechanism for funding the policy as a percentage of meetings in each area, as is the current phonline policy. I received messages from a few different areas and individuals in regards to the policy and have responded with what information was requested.

If we choose to move forward I believe there are several challenges we need to meet to make this happen. I believe we will need a single point of accountability to deal with the Insurance agency, as well as with the areas that will be requesting certificates of insurance for their groups or events. I believe we will need to create a committee, complete with policy and procedures to be worked out.

Although I have spoken with the insurance agent regarding some of the details of the coverage, I am not by any means, an insurance expert. I might be able to answer some questions today, but will likely have to pursue any definitive answers with the local agent.

*The motion to buy the insurance did pass, and a check for 25% of the annual premium was sent to the insurance agent to purchase the policy. Another motion was made and passed to create a subcommittee to manage the policy. A notice of an open position should therefore go out to the fellowship in this month's minutes.
