Hello Everyone,

The activity in our operating account since the last convention meeting was five early-bird registration refunds, reimbursement to the Registration chair for \$150 and Square fee returned on Square Early-Bird registration refunds processed. I received the folder of early-bird registrations on 10/08/20 that were received during the fundraising event in February. There was also a check for \$30 dated 3/30/20 and a

money order for \$15 dated 3/5/20. I called the member with the personal check for \$30, and he asked that I mail the check back to him. I have not deposited the \$15 money order to date, so the figure that states 41 registrations deposited does not include the registration paid by money order. H & I –

H&I met via Zoom yesterday, Saturday October 11th, 2020. 8 areas were in attendance (Boston, CCA, Central MA, Greater Providence, MetroWest, NEMA, SSA, Western MA). I still haven't had any contact with the SEMA chair and was wondering if anyone here today can put me in touch with them?

The DOC Coordinator had nothing to report. WSR reports that 1 addict is still actively writing, he moved from the Bridgewater facility to Concord, so Maryanne informed the addict who is writing to him. All areas who attended yesterday are bringing H&I meetings on Zoom into facilities. We have H&I meetings on Zoom in roughly 60+ facilities. Majority of areas are offering H&I meetings to multiple facilities each night.

Boston has created the position of “COVID Coordinator” to basically serve as the panel leader for all facilities to improve communication for the duration of the pandemic.

MetroWest is experiencing low facility attendance. They signed in on Zoom 3 weeks in a row for an H&I presentation with no facilities signing in.

NEMA reports that Middleton Prison is interested in setting up H&I presentations on Zoom. They have created an ADHOC policy. They are having a learning day on November 22nd.

The Greater Providence area is having a learning day on November 12th @ 7pm and any support from other areas would be greatly appreciated. I am hoping to get the flyers for both learning days to send our secretary.

SSA reports that their subcommittee meeting attendance is improving. They were taking commitments into Brockton Highpoint, but some patients got COVID so in person commitments here are temporarily on hold.

A lot of facilities in different areas are now requesting in person H&I presentations. We had 1 email this month from Highpoint in Plymouth requesting in person commitments. CCA and SSA are going to work together to accommodate this request. CCA has been in touch with the staff member and are planning to discuss going in there at their next H&I subcommittee meeting. I forwarded the information to SSA chair and he is going to contact them as well. This facility has been served for a few years by the CCA and SSA.

Areas are asking if Region is printing out any meeting lists. Central MA reports they have been printing their own area meeting lists to give facilities. Areas continue to encourage facilities to look up meeting information on NERNA but are concerned that the facilities aren't printing and distributing the meeting lists to patients. A member asked if there is a way Region can turn the meeting list into a PDF so it's easier for people to print out and if there is a way to keep updating the list if it's in a PDF format. Areas who are having in person H&I meetings are printing out the readings for patients to read and then not collecting them back. I am proud to report that everyone has done a wonderful job following facility guidelines and taking precautions when bringing H&I commitments in person. I brought up a new

facility that was just built in Canton and the Vice Chair is going to reach out to them to see if they would like us to bring in virtual H&I commitments, SSA Chair expressed willingness to take on a new facility and will discuss at their next subcommittee meeting. Lastly, a member brought up concerns about Zoom bombing during H&I presentations. There is some concern that H&I commitment information is making its way on to social media platforms. We discussed the importance of using passcodes and waiting rooms and only sharing this information with facilities. Some speculate this is happening because facilities are having to share the information with multiple staff members so the staff members can sign the patients on to Zoom.

We had no motions. Our Secretary position is currently vacant.

World Service Conference (WSC) & NAWS WSO News

WSC 2020 began on 24 April and officially adjourned on 13 August, when the summary of decisions was posted on na.org. It was the first virtual WSC, and it was also the longest amount of time between beginning and ending a WSC—sixteen weeks!. When we started losing meetings, and it was almost instantaneously, too, the idea of getting a conscience from the groups was not even at the forefront. Many of our members immediately jumped into "work mode," and without guidance from a service body or a committee, we began to help groups move to a virtual world.

Getting ourselves and our members was the priority. Once we set that up, we began to talk about service delivery, and you know the rest - we kicked butt. I want to acknowledge our COVID Response Team and their many efforts and the countless members around the country that helped save Narcotics Anonymous and, in the process, tens of thousands of addicts.

Again, getting a regional conscience was an afterthought at this point. The World Service Conference (WSC) went virtual as well, and we now had to get our group tally sheets any way we could. We tried using Slack; we tried using email blasts, phone calls, texts, anything, and everything we could to get the word out that we needed support from the groups on how to vote. In the end, we received a total of twelve group tally sheets and two area tally sheets. A representation of a total of 2.23% of our groups participated in this year WSC. Undoubtedly, COVID-19 played a significant role in this, but this is still a trend I have been seeing.

Over the past two years, I have done my best to serve this body with the utmost integrity and transparency. I have had some beautiful experiences due to this service you have allowed me to participate in; the WSC was not one of those experiences for me. The WSC took place solely on Zoom; it felt like the world's longest business meeting and did not feel spiritual but rather mechanical. Nonetheless, James and I showed up and represented this region as best we could with what little guidance we could get. I know I truly believe we did what we thought was in the best interest and most in line with how this region operates: we hope you felt the same way.


